

Class 3 & Class 4 visit to Madni Mosque ~ Wednesday 5 February 2025

SchoolGrid ~ Online School Meal Ordering

Please remember that parents/carers are responsible for ordering school meals via SchoolGrid. The school cook checks the system every morning and prepares hot meals based on the number of pre-orders on the system at that time.

Please note that if your child does not have a pre-ordered meal in place, they will be served the default option of either a wrap, jacket potato or baguette. It is therefore important that orders are placed on the system in advance to ensure your child is not disappointed. Thank you for your support.

Smartphone Safety Workshop: Empowering Parents with Practical Guidance





On Wednesday, 22nd February, Amy Boy, Parent Representative for the Smartphone-Free Childhood Movement (SMFC), hosted a valuable parent workshop at our school. She was joined by Anna Sarjantson from Screen-safe-resources.co.uk, an organisation dedicated to helping families navigate the challenges of smartphone use among children.

The workshop aimed to equip parents with practical information and strategies to safeguard children in the digital world. Although attendance was lower than expected, the discussion was incredibly insightful, sparking meaningful conversations about the impact of smartphones on childhood and how to foster a balanced, safe environment for our children. Those who attended agreed that the information shared was essential and should reach the wider school community.


LEGENDS Holiday Club will be open from 8am to 6pm. Breakfast and a light snack will be provided but please send your child with a packed lunch.




LSA Funding
