Mrs Bateman led an assembly to reinforce the messages of this year's Safer Internet Day - Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from online scams.


The children participated in the assembly by discussing their thoughts and experiences, answering questions and taking part in quizzes to test their

#### World Book Day ~ Thursday 6 March 2025

WOW! You all looked amazing yesterday, dressed up in your favourite story book character or cosy pyjamas to celebrate this year's World Book Day.

**Class 1** looked wonderful! They enjoyed talking about their costumes and sharing story books with their friends. During maths we used a story book

to learn a new way of counting - did you know that 1 is a snail and 2 is a person? In our French lesson we shared 'Ours brun, ours brun' which is the French version of 'Brown bear, Brown bear' by Bill Martin and Eric Carle. This half term we are learning traditional and fairy tales and will continue to share wonderful books every day!

**Class 2** have had a fantastic day in school for World Book Day! We shared our favourite stories and wrote our own book reviews to share with our peers. We also took part in the BBC Live Lesson for World Book Day and designed our own book covers and bookmarks!

**Class 3** have taken part in the BBC live lesson and have enjoyed learning about different genres. We discussed the genres that the children are interested in. Some popular genres were: fantasy, adventure, mystery and historical fiction as well as biographies, cookbooks and encyclopedia for non-fiction.

Year 3 and Year 5 also buddied up to share their favourite books.

Class 4 have had a day packed full of reading to celebrate World Book Day 2025. The children put their creativity to work by designing vibrant posters that highlighted their love for reading. These posters featured their favourite authors, ideal reading locations, and top tips for finding a great book. Each student shared their personal insights on what makes a book special, sparking a love for reading among their classmates.

The class also took part in a fun and engaging reading quiz, testing their knowledge of books and characters. To make the day even more special, the children joined other classes in the school to share their favourite books, characters, and reading experiences. It was a wonderful celebration of storytelling and the joy of reading!



#### Class 3 Roman Day and Class 4 Viking Day at Murton Park, York ~ Thursday 13 March 2025





We are all very excited about our trip to Murton Park next Thursday. **Please arrive at school at 7.50am**. The coach will leave school promptly at 8.00am. They will return to school at approximately 4.30pm.

<u>Travel Sickness</u>: If your child suffers with travel sickness (this should be detailed on the completed consent form), please ensure they take a tablet before they arrive in the morning and send another for the return journey; please place this in an envelope detailing their name and any specific instructions, and hand this to a member of staff on arrival at school. Please inform a member of staff if your child has taken a tablet before arriving at school on Thursday morning. *If your child suffers from travel sickness and* 

you forgot to include this on the consent form, please email the school office immediately to enable us to add to our risk assessment.

The children will spend the day experiencing life in a Viking/Roman village and we have been advised that children should come in 'playing out' clothes (eg leggings, tracksuits, hoodies but NO JEANS). Please ensure they also have outerwear and footwear appropriate for the outdoor weather conditions on the day. They will be given a simple period costume to wear on arrival.

All children will require a packed lunch (**no foods containing nuts and no glass bottles please**). If you have pre-ordered a school meal for your child that day, please ensure this is deleted on SchoolGrid to avoid being charged.

In the event that there is a delay on the return journey, we will keep parents/carers up-to-date via the text message system.

The school has received 87% of voluntary contributions towards this trip which unfortunately does not make this financially viable. We have, however, made the decision to go ahead with this visit due to the high-quality learning experience provided by this museum and the significant impact it will have on the children's learning.

At Lothersdale, we are committed to providing the best possible experiences for all our children, but we cannot finance these visits without a voluntary contribution from parents/carers. We thank you for your continued support to ensure we can continue to offer these wonderful school visits for the children.
