






CLASS 3 CURRICULUM PLAN – SPRING 1 2020



Subject	Key learning
<p><u>Science</u> Electricity</p> 	<p>In this topic we will describe the simple functions of a basic circuit. Children will identify the different symbols for each electrical part within a circuit and will be able to build their own circuits to make a buzzer or light work. All children will know which materials conduct electricity and which will not.</p> <p>We will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identify electrical symbols.• Build simple and parallel circuits.• Know and explain why some materials conduct electricity and some don't.• Know how electricity flows.
<p><u>History</u> Victorians</p> 	<p>We will delve into the history of the Victorian era by studying what life was like during the reign of Queen Victoria. This history unit will allow the children to investigate the lives of the Victorians and why they are so significant today.</p> <p>We will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Place the Victorian era on a timeline and compare what else was happening prior to and at the same time.• Understand the significance some famous Victorians have on our lives today.• Focus on the importance of Queen Victoria herself.• Learn how the Victorians lived
<p><u>Art</u> Who is L.S. Lowry?</p> 	<p>Children will learn to use a range of colours in the style of L.S Lowry. The children will focus on the importance of whom he was and why he is famous today.</p> <p>We will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• study and analyse his style of painting and compare his work to other artist of the same time.• Explain his passion for capturing the 'industrial landscape' and recreate a picture using our local surroundings.

Investigate the UK and the local area



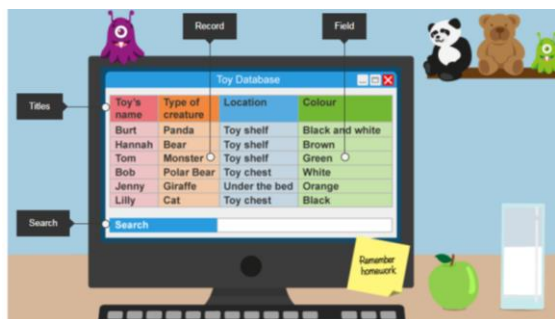
