 - Reading at least 3x per week at home. This is so important.
 - Practice spellings for Monday test. (not begun yet).



What can you do at home?

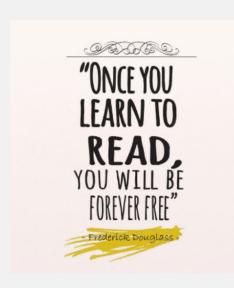
- By far the most important thing for you to do at home is read. That can be school books, home books, magazines, library books etc. The more reading your child does the more successful they will be through school. Asking questions about what they have read such as; What does that word mean? How is that character feeling? etc will really help your child in class. Vocabulary and use of language is so important and children will learn most of this from their reading. Unfortunately, it is also very difficult to find time to read with 30 children more than once a week. If we could, we would read with them every day. Instead we do group reading sessions and fit it in around our writing work, so the more you can do the better.
- For maths, counting forwards and backwards from different numbers is the most common thing children struggle with so at the beginning of the year, this is a great start. Year 2's can really benefit from beginning to learn their 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
- If there is ever anything we feel your child could benefit from more of at home, we will be sure to let you know.

Reading

Reading is incredibly important at this stage of your child's education. It is also the area we have found to have been impacted the most due to the COVID lock down. The more you can read at home with your child, the better. We have put lots of reading interventions in place in school also.

- We aim to read with the Year 1's and 2's once a week.
- Guided Reading 3x per week in school.
- Personal Reading time.
- · Reading/library Area.



 Reading at home - please read at least 3x per week, we can really see the difference between those who are regular readers and those who aren't.



Literacy

- We use a class text, usually a new one every half term, as a stimulus for most of our writing activities. This means the children follow a journey of writing and are really immersed and engaged in all of the activities. Currently we are doing Giraffes Can't Dance.
- For the first half term we are working on:

Year 1 - neat presentation, handwriting, using capital letters, finger spaces and full stops and also using adjectives to make sentences more interesting.

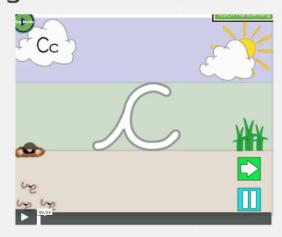
Year 2 - we are recapping and focusing on all of the above in more detail. We are looking at sentence structure and building our knowledge of adjectives to using expanded noun phrases.

- We encourage lots of reading and discussion during writing lessons.
- Daily handwriting sessions.

Maths

- We begin with a big focus on number. That is counting forward and backwards from different numbers, recognising and writing numbers, comparing numbers and being able to use language such as more than and less than. These are all things that you can continue at home.
- Fluency and deepening of knowledge is key to mastering the curriculum and retaining knowledge over time.
- We use low stakes assessments called Remember, Recall, Reflect, to demonstrate children retaining knowledge over time.

Phonics

- Jolly phonics continues from class 1 actions to match sounds.
- Year 1 Phonics screening learning and application of digraphs and trigraphs to sound and blend pseudo and real words.
- Year 2 Continues on to latter phases throughout all writing big focus on spelling rules and patterns via rising stars spelling.
- We use Rising stars phonics to support our programme of learning.



Blocking

- Foundation subjects to be blocked to improve depth of learning.
 This means we will cover an intensive 2/3 weeks worth of
 history in our topic afternoons, followed by 2/3 weeks of science
 and so on rather than doing one session of each per week.
- Weekly French, Music and PE will continue.
- Linked with cross curricular approach.

Golden Rules, Team Points & The Rainbow

- Class 2 golden rules are consistent throughout the whole school. Children are made aware of their choice.
- Marbles are used in their house teams (lions, tigers, panthers and leopards) as team points - there will be winning team each week.
- Rainbow system is continued from Class 1 both positive and negative. - individual praise.
