

Lothersdale Primary School believes in promoting Sun Safety to ensure that children and staff are protected from skin damage caused by the harmful ultra-violet rays in sunlight.

As part of our Sun Safety Policy Lothersdale School will:

- Educate children throughout the curriculum about the causes of skin cancer and how to protect their skin;
- Encourage children to wear clothes that provide good sun protection, including sunhats at break times, and use sun screens where appropriate;
- Seek shade, particularly in the middle of the day and to use shady areas during breaks, lunchtimes, sports and trips;
- Encourage staff and parents to act as good role models by practicing sun safety;
- Regularly remind children, staff and parents about sun safety through newsletters, posters and activities for pupils;
- Drink plenty of water during hot, sunny weather;
- Make sure the Use of Sun Screen Policy is working. We will regularly monitor our curriculum, assess shade provision, and review the sun safety behaviour of students and staff (use of hats, shade, etc.)

Lothersdale Primary School wishes to encourage students to protect themselves from the sun. One way of doing this is to use sun screen at the appropriate time. If a pupil is to use sun screen at school, parents are asked to:

1. Provide the sun screen product for school use. The sun screen must be:
  - a. Clearly marked with the child's name.
  - b. Replenished by the parent as needed.
2. The sun screen product will be stored in the child's classroom in a location designated by the teacher.
3. The child must be able to apply his or her own sun screen (except Reception children).
4. For Reception parents: They are asked to apply sun screen at home before a typical school day, this will be reapplied as necessary by staff.

If it is considered necessary for teachers/staff to assist with the application of sun screen, the sun screen will only be applied to face, neck, arms, hands and lower legs. Parents are asked to provide written instruction to teachers for their child's individual needs.
