Health & Safety Update!

The Woodland Area

Work started over the summer holidays on the redevelopment of our woodland area and work is currently ongoing. As the area is a construction site, please ensure that your children do <u>not</u> enter the woodland area until further notice. We thank you for your cooperation.

Lining up time at 8.55am

We understand that parents/carers want to stay on the playground in a morning to see their children go into school and catch up with their friends, however the lining up procedure has felt very congested this week and we feel we need to make some changes to help ensure that the children can step clearly into their Year Group lines.

Therefore, from Monday we would like to request that on the second bell at 8.55am, parents/carers should pass coats and bags to their children and then walk towards the woodland fence at the bottom of the playground, leaving the children to walk into their lines. This will result in the area around the children being free from parents/carers and less congested. You are then very welcome to remain at the bottom of the playground to watch the children line up and be taken into school. This will enable all the children to clearly see their class teachers and follow their instructions, and also show you how smartly they can line up in silence.

We have been working very hard this week to sharpen up the children's conduct and behaviour around school and we want to ensure that they have a calm start to the school day and are as ready as possible for learning. The children know that they are expected to line up in silence on the playground and we hope you will support us all in achieving this.

Mrs Slaven has been a wonderful member of staff and we will all miss her and wish her all the best in her retirement. Parents of children who received support from her will be notified of the additional arrangements for their children next week.

Making Contact with Class Teachers before school

Lothersdale Primary School is very proud of its 'open door policy' and its strong relationship with parents/carers and families. Throughout the year there will be times when parents/carers need to talk to teachers before school when something has 'cropped up' e.g. their child is upset about something. It is very important to us that these matters are followed up quickly and we would request that parents/carers follow the procedures below. These are in preference to waiting until the class teacher collects his/her class from the playground at 8.55am, as this can result in the teachers being late for registration and delay the start of lessons. Also, between 8.45 and 8.55am, class teachers are talking to their teaching assistants about the morning lessons and we would ask parents/carers to avoid requesting to speak to teachers at this time.

If you wish to speak to a class teacher, or Mrs Robinson, before school starts please either:

- Telephone school between 8.00 and 8.15am to arrange a short face to face meeting or telephone call with a class teacher or Mrs Robinson on the same morning before school between 8.30 and 8.45am.
- If the query is less important, please telephone school between 8.00am and 12.00pm and leave a message for a teacher to telephone you back on the same day and answer your questions or to make an appointment to meet in school.

Please also note that class teachers will normally be on the playground at the end of the school day and are available to talk to at this time as well.

Peanut Allergy

Just to remind parents/carers at the beginning of the new school year that we do have a number of children in school with an allergy to peanuts. We would therefore be grateful if parents could try and avoid pack-ups or sweets containing peanuts/peanut butter and would greatly appreciate your support in this matter. If children do bring in items containing peanuts, we would be very grateful to be made aware so that the children with allergies do not come into contact with them.

School Uniform

May we remind parents/carers that traditional black school shoes should be worn by children in school as part of our School Uniform Policy. Please <u>do not</u> send children in black boots (this includes Doc Martins), trainers, fashion shoes or ballet style shoes as these are not regulated footwear suitable for everyday school life. We attach a copy of our school uniform list for your information and would be grateful if all parents/carers could adhere to our uniform policy.

Long Hair

May we remind parents/carers that children with long hair (below shoulder height) <u>must</u> have hair tied back in a ponytail/plait.

Fruit

Please note that children in Class 1 and Class 2 receive fruit as a snack every day as part of the government's 'Keeping Healthy' campaign.

Children in Class 3 and Class 4 receive fruit on Tuesdays and Thursdays, which is kindly provided by Lothersdale School Association. Your child can also bring a piece of fruit to school from home on any day of the week if he/she wishes to do so.

Attendance

Pupil Unauthorised Leave of Absence during 2017-2018

Please note that <u>97</u> school days were lost through pupils taking unauthorised leave of absence during term time in the 2017-2018 academic year at Lothersdale Primary School. This is a large decline on last year's figures and, as Ofsted inspectors are particularly focused on as high a percentage of pupil attendance as possible, this is an area where parents/carers can support us by helping Lothersdale School to maintain high attendance levels. Therefore we include the following reminders:

<u>Pupil Leave of Absence from school during Term Time</u>

Leave of absence will only be authorised if the appropriate criteria has been met - please see the school's Leave of Absence in Term Time Policy on the school website. Following Government Guidelines since September 2013, the Headteacher is not authorised to grant leave of absence during term time in any other circumstances than those stated.

Medical Appointments

<u>34</u> school days were missed through pupils taking medical appointments during term time in the 2017-2018 academic year. Please ensure where possible that <u>all</u> appointments are made outside school hours. We understand that this may not always be possible, but would urge you to ensure that your child has the highest attendance levels as possible.

Traffic Management outside school

The yellow markings have been put down outside school on behalf of North Yorkshire County Council and The Parish Council to alleviate traffic flow and are enforceable.

We would therefore remind parents/carers to refrain from parking on the yellow zig zags or from doing three point turns outside school and Out of School Club when dropping off and picking up children from school. Not only is this an important health and safety issue but villagers, who do not have children in the school, still need to be able to travel freely through the village at these peak times. We would be grateful for your cooperation in this matter.

Autumn Term Curriculum

Class 1 ~ Change of Clothing

Although we do have a small number of clothing items available to change your child into, we would be grateful if parents/carers of children in Class 1 could ensure their child has an extra set of underwear (plus tights where applicable) to help us guarantee we have enough clothing in school in case of "little" accidents!

As the children in Class 1 have settled in so well this week, we would like to invite parents of children in Class 1 to come in to join their child for a short 'stay and play' on Wednesday 12 September 2018 from 9.00 to 9.30am. Class 4 ~ Walking home from school

We are happy for children in Class 4 to walk home from school, or to an agreed meeting point, unaccompanied from the school playground <u>but only upon written consent from parents/carers</u>. If you would like your child to walk home from school, please ensure that a parent signed letter of permission is sent in to the school office ~ children must be collected from school as normal unless written consent is in place.

Year 6 ~ Secondary School Admissions (September 2019)

Letters were sent out yesterday to all current Year 6 pupils regarding the admissions process for applying for a place at secondary school in September 2019. Please note that the deadline for online submission of application forms is <u>31 October 2018</u>.

Class 4 Residential Visit to Marrick Priory and Parents' Information Evening

The Marrick Priory residential visit will take place on 12 to 16 November 2018 and the Parent Information Pack will be sent out to parents/carers of pupils in Class 4 prior to the information evening. Please remember that the Marrick Priory Payment Account is already set up on ParentPay to enable parents/carers to pay regular amounts at your convenience and payment should be made in full by <u>Friday 19 October 2018</u>. A Parents' Information Evening will take place in school on **Monday 15 October at 2018 7.00pm** ~ please note that pupils should not attend as this enables parents to freely discuss any concerns they may have. Pupils will be able to discuss Marrick Priory in class with Mrs Fawcett nearer the time of the visit.

PE Sessions ~ Autumn Term

Now that the majority of our PE sessions are spent outdoors, it would be beneficial if all children (Class 1 to Class 4) have a pair of trainers for these sessions. Black pumps are ideal for indoor use but not supportive enough for running and high impact PE sessions.

Please remember that <u>full PE kit</u> should be in school when your child is taking part in PE sessions. A PE bag check was carried out this week in school by the teaching assistants who were very surprised to find that a large proportion of the older children's clothing was unnamed! We would remind parents/carers that all PE kit should be kept in the <u>Lothersdale PE bag</u>, which is available from the school uniform shops in Skipton, in line with the school's Uniform Policy.

Please also ensure that all items of PE kit are <u>clearly named</u> and all children have the correct items of clothing as per the school uniform policy:

Royal Blue Shorts
Black Plimsolls (indoors) & Trainers (outdoors)
Royal Blue School PE Hoody (optional)
Dark Tracksuit Bottoms (optional) (Autumn/Winter)

Water Bottles

We are introducing a new style of water bottle in school and, if your child has received one of these bottles this week, we would be grateful for feedback. This will enable us to determine whether to continue with the current style (the actual bottle has not changed but the lid is different). Many thanks for your support.

Homework

Homework expectations for the year will be discussed in more detail during the Curriculum Evenings for parents on Monday 17 September 2018.

Following this first week back in school, the following activities have been established with classes 2, 3 and 4:

<u>Class 2</u> ~ Children have been allocated their new reading books and are expected to read at home <u>at least 3 times per week</u> for up to 15 mins. Other homework activities will begin next week (however Year 2 children have a 2x table sheet in their book bags to practice ready for work in class next week).

<u>Class 3</u> ~ Children have been allocated their new reading books and are expected to read at home <u>at least 3 times per week</u> for up to 20 mins. Spellings will be been given out on a Monday and will be tested on a Thursday (the full list of spellings for the half term will also be given to the children to allow families to organise when they will practice spellings and is also available on the Class 3 page on the school website) - children need to spend time at home learning these and may need support to identify those on the word list they find tricky and a particular focus placed on these ones. Learn by heart facts, now known as KIRFS (Key Instant Recall Facts), will start next week. Homework books will be sent home on Monday and a timetable for all the activities will be displayed in the front.

<u>Class 4</u> ~ Children have been allocated their new reading books and are expected to read at home <u>at least 3 times per week</u> for up to 20 mins. Spellings have been given out and will be tested on Monday (the full list of spellings for the half term will also be given to the children to allow families to organise when they will practice spellings and is also available on the Class 4 page on the school website) - children need to spend time at home learning these and may need support to identify those on the word list they find tricky and a particular focus placed on these ones. Learn by heart facts, now known as KIRFS (Key Instant Recall Facts), have also been sent out for learning at home and have already started to be tested in school. Maths and English books will be given out on alternative weeks on a Friday to be brought back to school on a Wednesday. A timetable has been discussed at length with the children and stuck in the front of their homework diaries.

Extended Schools Activities ~ w/c 10 September 2018

Extended Schools Activities will resume on Monday 10 September 2018 and the activity lists are now available to view in the main reception area. Please note that Woodland Club and Rugby Tots have proved extremely popular and unfortunately it has not been possible to accommodate all children in these clubs. Please ensure you check these lists prior to the activities taking place to avoid any confusion over the times you need to collect your child from school. All children must be collected promptly at the end of each session.

Please note that children will use their PE kit for all indoor clubs, including dance, and \underline{no} other clothing should be brought into school. Providers will ensure the children are changed back into their school uniform at the end of the session so that PE kit remains in school.

Children taking part in outdoor clubs ~ Running, Rugby Tots, Football ~ can bring in additional sports clothing for these sessions only to ensure they are warm outside.

School Photographs

The photographer will be in school on Tuesday 11 September 2018 to take individual/family group (children only) photographs. A letter was sent out yesterday with further details and we would be grateful if you could return the reply slip by Monday 10 September 2018 if you have not already done so ~ the photographer will not be able to take your child's photograph if we do not receive the reply slip. Please note that children must be in full school uniform.

Curriculum Evenings ~ Monday 17 September 2018

Following the success of our Curriculum Evenings for parents/carers last year we will, once again, be offering all parents/carers the opportunity to come into school early in the academic year and meet their child's class teacher and teaching assistants.

Each event will last for approximately 45 minutes and parents/carers will find out about classroom routines and activities, homework timetables and how they can support learning at home during the school year. North Yorkshire County Music Service

We have several peripatetic teachers in school on a weekly basis from the County Music Service to teach singing and guitar lessons etc. This arrangement is made between parents and the Music Service. The school currently has access to a selection of musical instruments eg. Violin, clarinet, flute, guitar and trumpets, which are available for pupils to use. A Data Collection sheet containing details of each child in school will be sent out in a sealed enveloped marked 'private and confidential' to all parents/carers via bookbags on Monday. This information is held on the school's management information system and will be used to collate data for the School Census at the beginning of October. It is therefore important that you check the sheet(s) carefully and sign to confirm that the information held is correct, amending any incorrect details accordingly. Please return to school by Monday 17 September 2018.

Class 3 Swimming Lessons ~ Payments

Please note that the deadline for payment of contributions towards Class 3 swimming lessons for autumn term first half has now passed and some contributions remain outstanding. Please note that, although these lessons are part of the school curriculum, the school receives no extra funding for swimming or transport costs and relies on parental contributions to enable the children to take part in this activity. No child will be excluded if his or her parents/carers do not contribute, but if insufficient voluntary contributions are received then regrettably, this activity will not go ahead. If you have not yet made a contribution and still wish to do so, please ensure that payment is made as soon as possible to enable us to ensure we meet our providers' costs.

Jewellery and Nail Varnish


If your child wears ear-rings they should be removed prior to PE sessions for health & safety reasons. Nail varnish on fingers and toes must not be worn at all times.
