Visitor to School ~ Danielle Brown MBE ~ Wednesday 20 November 2019

Danielle Brown MBE is a British competitive archer, who started archery on her fifteenth birthday after her disability stopped her from taking part in the sports she loved. Three years later she was on the Great Britain team, jumping in as World Number 1 and hanging onto that position for the rest of her career. Danielle won gold at the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games and retained her title in London 2012, as well as winning five World Championship Titles. She became the first disabled person to represent England at the Commonwealth Games (and win gold) as an able-bodied athlete.

Danielle has also co-authored 'Be Your Best Self' with nine-year-old Nathan Kai, with the view of helping children raise aspirations and develop the resilience and confidence to be the best they can be. Above all it lets children know that they are unique, valuable and important and that we can achieve our dreams if we work hard and develop our strengths and weaknesses.

We are very proud to have Danielle back in school ~ not only because of her fantastic achievements, but because she was brought up in Lothersdale and attended Lothersdale Primary School! Class 1 Handwashing ~ Wednesday 13 November 2019

On Wednesday Class 1 welcomed Jane from the school nursing team, who talked to all the Reception children about the importance of handwashing.

They learnt that they need to wash their hands after sneezing, handling pets and using the toilet; before eating and when hands are dirty or muddy.







They also learnt to clean hands properly by using warm water, soap and, most importantly, to ensure hands are dry after washing as germs like wet hands! In school we also use hand gel after drying.

Jane brought along an ultra-violet box and the children put hand gel on their hands in the ultra-violet box so they could see the gel on their hands and then washed and dried their hands and put them back in the box to see how well they had washed off the gel. They were all given a special Handwashing Certificate at the end of the session!



Gardening for Hedgehogs

The hedgehog is one of the most easily recognized, characterful and charming of British mammals yet they are rapidly disappearing from the wild - in the 1950's the British population was 30 million, current these foods. estimates are that of 1million.

Hedgehogs are normally solitary and nocturnal. During spring and summer they sleep in temporary nests, waking at dusk to hunt for food, climbing low stone walls, fences and even swimming across water. They are very noisy with their snuffling and grunting as they shuffle through undergrowth. An adult hedgehog has 3-5000 spines, a tail and can live for 6 years.

They eat beetles, earthworms, caterpillars, snails, slugs - so a very welcome ally in the garden. They are also partial to birds' eggs, frogs, baby rodents and in autumn soft fruit is eaten. They need to weigh at least 650g by late autumn in order to survive their hibernation. Supplementing their diet through autumn can help top up their fat stores leaving out DRY cat biscuits (IAMS chicken flavour is

a favourite), or wet cat food - again chicken flavour along with plenty of FRESH drinking water in a shallow saucer with a bit of gravel in to stop evaporation. Please DO NOT feed mealworms, milk, cheese or bread as they are intolerant to

Springtime is breeding season. If you hear loud snorting and puffing at night (similar to Saturday night revellers!) in the garden it may be the male (boar) hog attempting to woo his female (sow) by circling her (sometimes for hours!) trying to persuade her to mate. After mating the male leaves, taking no part in rearing the young. Hoglets are born from May onwards in litters of up to five. Their spines are sheathed beneath their skin at birth, then emerge over the first few hours. By July, the hoglets will leave the nest to forage with their mother, becoming independent and solitary from August onwards, and along with all hedgehogs hibernating from November to March.

Lothersdale has quite a few hedgehogs and our gardens are an ideal habitat for them, but we can do more to help. Here are a few tips for making your garden a safe place for them:

- 1. Create 'hedgehog highways' by creating a 13cm x 13 cm hole in your garden fences or walls.
- 2. Avoid slug pellets. Hedgehogs are natural 'pest controllers'.
- 3. Make pond and other water features, hedgehog-friendly. Although hedgehogs are good swimmers, they cannot climb out of step sided ponds. If you cannot create a shallow area, then make a ramp from plank wrapped in chicken wire. Provide clean drinking water in shallow rimmed water bowls with gravel in to reduce evaporation.



- 4. Create a garden with a variety of plants that attract plenty of natural hedgehog food choosing plant species that are attractive to a range of creatures (www.rhs.org.uk/perfectforpollinators). Mulch beds with home grown garden compost to encourage earthworms and woodlice. Fallen leaves make perfect nesting material. Leaving patches of longer grass encourages insects. A bug hotel out of logs and hollow stems creates habitats for 'hogfood'.
- 5. Purpose built hedgehog homes (https://www.hedgehogstreet.org/help-hedgehogs/hedgehog-homes/) for them to nest in and hibernate. Essentially this is a box with a hinged lid and tunnel entrance. Locate them in undergrowth and cover with leaves/soil. Ensure entrance does not face north or north east, to keep it draught free. Place some leaves/straw near the entrance to encourage occupancy!
- 6. Think 'Hedgehog' when working in the garden. Check the area where you plan to cut, strim or mow. Check for hidden hedgehogs, before lighting bonfires. Move bonfire material to another part of garden, prior to lighting.
- 7. Provide artificial food (see previously) and fresh water. Set up a feeding station by cutting a hole in a storage box, weighing down the lid with bricks, to deter foxes/cats. To deter rats, do not put out grain-based foods on the floor.
- 8. Dispose of litter responsibly so many hedgehogs are injured by thoughtless litter disposal getting trapped in discarded tins and jars.



- LETHARGIC seek veterinary advice.
- FLIES ON THE HOG definitely needs professional help
- WOBBLY if they are wobbling as they walk seek professional help
- HOGLETS if seen out in the day without an adult and/or squawking take advice from your local vet.
- OBVIOUSLY INJURED/TRAPPED take the appropriate action and contact your local vet for on-going advice.

FIRST AID FOR HEDGEHOGS:

- Use gardening gloves or a folded towel to gently pick up the hog and put into a high sided box with a WARM NOT HOT hot water bottle underneath a thick towel. Place another towel over the hog.
- Bring the box indoors to a quiet place.
- Offer a small amount of hedgehog food as previously described and some water do not force feed.
- If it is a small hog check nearby for others that may be from the same litter who may also be in trouble. Call either your local vet or the British Hedgehog Preservation Society (01584 890801) www.britishhedgehogs.org.uk

Finally take care on the roads – hedgehogs are nocturnal – their natural defence is to roll into a ball – this is no match for a speeding motor vehicle.
