What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

At National Online Safety, we believe in empowering parents, carers and trusted aduits with the information to hold an inform It is needed. This guide facuses on one of many issues which we believe trusted aduits should be aware of. Please visit www

Defined as "ongoing hurtful behaviour towards someone online", cyber-bullying makes its victims feel upset, uncomfortable and unsafe. In the digital world, it has numerous forms – such as hurtful comments on a person's posts or profile; deliberately leaving them out of group chats; sharing embarrassing images or videos of someone; or spreading gossip about them. Cyber-bullying can severely impact a young person's mental health ... so, in support of Anti-Bullying Week, we've provided a list of tips to help trusted adults know what to look for and how to respond to it. for and how to respond to it.

1. GET CONNECTED

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2. KEEP TALKING

Regular chats with young people about their online lives are good practice in general, but they can also be an excellent refresher to help prevent cyber-bullying situations. Topics you might war revisit include why it's important only connect online with people know and trust, and why passwo should always remain secret (ev from our best friends).

3. STAY VIGILANT

4. MAKE YOURSELF AVAILABLE

If an online bullying incident does occur, it may take a while before your child is ready to open up abo what happened. Just gently remin them that they can always come t you with any problems - and that they won't be in trouble. You might also suggest a trusted family member they could turn to, in case they feel too embarrassed to tell you directly.

6. EMPOWER YOUR CHILD

n about online safety with their children, should they feel safety.com for further guides, hints and tips for aduits.

Depending on their age, your child might not want a parent flighting their battles for them'. In that case, talk through their options with them (blocking the perpetrator, deleting the app and so on). By allowing your child to choose the path they take, you're putting them in control but are als demonstrating that you're there to support them along the way.

7. REPORT BULLIES ONLINE

8. ENCOURAGE EMPATHY

Protecting themselves online is the priority, of course, but young people should diso feel empowered to help if they witness other people failing victim to cyberbuilying. Even if they don't feel confident enough to call someone out on their abusive behaviour online, they can still confidentially report that person to the app or game where the builying occurred.

9. SEEK EXPERT ADVICE

10. INVOLVE THE AUTHORITIES

If the nature of any online bullying makes you suspect that your child is genuinely in imminent physical danger -or if there are any signs whatsoever of explicit images being shared as part of the bullying - then you should gather any relevant screenshots as evidence and report the incidents to your local police force.
