Dear Parents/Carers

It has been a very busy week in school this week with lots of work going on around Anti-Bullying Week and preparations for Children in Need today; we've also had two days of parents' consultations.

The parents' consultation days were a real milestone for me as it's the first 'proper' consultation event we've been able to hold since I joined school last year. In the summer term we were able to meet outdoors, on a very unseasonably cold and wet evening, so it was really good to be able to meet with parents/carers indoors this time. These events are always quite exhausting for teachers, especially when spread over two days, but they are also extremely rewarding for us. It is genuinely lovely to be able to celebrate your children's successes with you and hear about how they are getting on at home and how they really feel about school. It was very reassuring to hear that the children feel extremely positive about school and that many express their love for school - as teachers and parents, we really couldn't ask for more than that.

One of the things that makes our school so lovely is the way that the children interact with each other, how the older ones help the younger ones out, and how friendships are formed across the different classes. We were able to celebrate these friendships and the very positive relationships between all members of our school this week during Anti-Bullying Week. We have enjoyed another lovely week of learning and fun in Class 1. All of the children have impressed us with their effort and concentration during our daily phonics lessons which are having such a positive impact on reading and early writing development.

Beginning the week with Odd Socks Day was a great way to teach how we can celebrate and express individuality. We built upon this learning with a focus on kindness. Mrs Gallagher, the children and I have been recognising acts of kindness and awarding special hearts to children who have used kind words and kind actions. We will continue this into next week and also share storybooks about friendships.

Thank you for joining me for our parent meetings this week, it was lovely to be able to tell you how proud we are of the children in Class 1. Please remember to pop in or contact school if you have any questions or concerns. Also, please all complete the Tapestry questionnaire so we can begin to share this learning platform with you.

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This week all the children in Class 2 have continued to show brilliant enthusiasm for learning. We have begun learning about subtraction in maths. Counting backwards is a lot trickier than counting forwards, particularly crossing the ten. The children have worked very hard and are making good progress.

We have begun learning about verbs in our writing. The children have loved starting our new class story, 'Gorilla' by Anthony Brown. The children have confidently developed their knowledge of verbs and have been able to find them in sentences and write sentences of their own using verbs.

We have also continued our learning on the United Kingdom. The children have loved learning about the 4 countries, and their capital cities, that together make the UK. Well done Class 2.

The children have used dictionaries to check the new vocabulary and are able to use the new words in their own sentence writing.

In science this week, the children have learnt more about our teeth, how important they are and the role each tooth plays.

In maths this week, Year 5 have been focusing on factors and Year 6 have been learning the method for long division. The KIRF check-up in school has involved units of time and the passage of time, and our homework covers fraction, percentage and decimal equivalents.

In history, we have continued with our study of the Tudor period, focusing on Henry VII and his children. Henry VIII, his wives, and his children have also been investigated.

**Pupils on Packed Lunches**

May we remind parents to ensure their child's pack up is clearly named and that it contains no nuts or foods containing nut ingredients. Many thanks.

**Change to Lunchtime Arrangements**

In order to help with the administration and ordering, parents must inform school in writing, giving two full weeks' term time notice, if a child is to change their lunchtime arrangements from school meal to packed lunches or vice-versa.

## Eligibility for Free School Meals

Free school meals are available for children whose parents meet the relevant criteria. If you are in receipt of one or more of the following benefits and think you may qualify, please either ask Mrs Ellison for an application form or use the application form available via [www.northyorks.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals](http://www.northyorks.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals)

The relevant criteria is based on receipt of:

- Universal Credit, (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Child Tax Credit, provided you are also not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual household gross income that does not exceed £16,190 (as assessed by HMRC)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- A run-on of Working Tax Credit – paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Where parents are entitled to working tax credit during a four week "run on" period immediately after their employment has ceased, or after they have started to work less than 16 hours per week, their children are entitled to free school meals. Children who receive income support or income based jobseeker's allowance in their own right are also entitled to free school meals.

Applications are usually processed the same day. If your child is entitled to free school meals you will receive a letter confirming the date when the meals will start. The school is also notified that your child is entitled to free school meals. In the meantime, you should continue to pay for free school meals until confirmation comes through. School may be able to arrange a reimbursement of any monies paid whilst your entitlement is being confirmed. If you are not entitled to free school meals you will be notified in writing.


