Class 3 Visit to Bradford Industrial Museum ~ Wednesday 31 January 2018







What a fantastic day we all had at the Bradford Industrial Museum on Wednesday! Everyone looked amazing in their Victorian costumes and we are very grateful for the effort they all made ~ being dressed up really enhanced their experience of life in the Victorian era.

In the morning, the children took part in a Victorian classroom workshop and learnt what it was like for Victorian school children ~ they had to line up and enter using separate entrances (one for boys and one for girls), use slate and slate pencil for the arithmetic, use pen and ink for handwriting and enjoyed an object lesson learning about coal. All the children could tell the difference between classrooms in 1870 and 2018. After lunch we walked around the woollen and weaving mill, looking at all the old machines. We were even allowed to see how the machines worked (they were very noisy) and could imagine how

busy and loud it would have been in the Victorian times. Unfortunately we didn't get to see everything we wanted, however the museum isn't very far away and is free entry for everyone, making it perfect for a great half term visit for families.

Miss Gallagher and all of class 3 would like to say a big 'thank you' to all the parent helpers ~ Mrs Oddy, Mrs Pierson and Mrs Woodhead ~ who gave up their time to support us on our visit.

#### Class 3 ~ Design & Technology

In design and technology this half-term, Class 3 have been looking at pneumatic systems and all the children have designed their own moving monsters based on what they have learnt so far. The children know which materials they need to make their monsters, but if there are items they need



that they cannot find in school they can also bring resources in from home e.g. plastic bottles and bottle tops. We look forward to seeing their monsters taking shape over the next few weeks.

After school on Wednesday 31 January 2018, some children from Class 3 and Class 4 joined other local primary schools at South Craven School for a Performing Arts Festival. 
