

Extended Schools ~ Spring Term 2024 Second Half

The activity flyer was emailed to parents/carers on Tuesday for extended schools' activities taking place after half-term. THE CLUBS WILL GO LIVE ON SCHOOLGATEWAY TOMORROW, SATURDAY 10 FEBRUARY 2024. Please ensure you read the bookings information before applying for a club place.

FREE Clubs: Please email the school office (<u>lothersdale@ycatschools.co.uk</u>) by <u>Wednesday 14 February</u> 2024 to book a FREE activity place for your child. It would be helpful if you could include the name of the club(s) in the subject header to help us identify the replies easily. Activities will be allocated on a first come first serve basis.

PAID Clubs: the deadline for payment for children taking part in paying clubs is <u>Wednesday 14 February</u> 2024 to enable your child to continue with his/her chosen club. Your child's name will only be entered on the activity lists once payment has been made. The extended schools' accounts will be removed from ParentPay once the deadline has passed so it is important that payments are made promptly.

All extended schools' activities finish on Friday 22 March 2024.

The activity lists will be sent out on Monday 19 February 2024. *Please note that we are unable to add your child to an activity list once the deadline has passed and the lists have been distributed to providers and LEGENDS. It is therefore important that you help us to avoid your child missing out on an activity by adhering to the stated deadline.*

There is no Art Club this half-term due to prior commitments, but Art Club will resume after Easter. There will be no Gymnastics Club on Monday 19 February 2024 due to Kanga Sports Staff Training Day.

Class 2 ~ Swimming Lessons



Class 2 swimming lessons will start on Friday 23 February 2024 and the deadline for contributions towards your child's block of lessons is Monday 18 March 2024. Thank you to those parents/carers who have already made a contribution. Swimming is an important part of the curriculum but unfortunately the school receives no extra funding for swimming and relies on parental contributions to enable the children to take part in this activity. No child will be excluded if his or her parents/carers do not contribute, but if insufficient voluntary contributions are received then, regrettably, we will have

to look at the viability of future swimming lessons, particularly as costs will increase next academic year.

Class 3 ~ Swimming Lessons

The deadline for making a contribution towards your child's swimming lessons has now passed. Unfortunately, the school is £1,260.40 short of the total required to make this activity financially viable, and it must now take money from the curriculum budget to pay for the shortfall. The payment remains open on School Gateway - if you have not yet made a contribution (however small), and still wish to do so, please ensure payment is made by Monday 19 February 2024.

As this shortfall has not been accounted for in this year's budget, it may mean that, sadly, some planned curriculum projects will now have to be cancelled.
