Letter from NYCC Public Health ~ Twice Weekly COVID-19 Home Testing

A letter from NYCC Public Health has been emailed to all parents/carers today regarding the introduction of twice weekly home testing for COVID-19 for all members of households living with primary and secondary school age children as well as college students.

Please take the time to read the letter which also explains how to access the home test kits and we thank you for playing your part in helping to reduce the spread of COVID-19 across North Yorkshire. A copy of the letter is also attached to this newsletter.

Picking Up and Dropping Off ~ Before and After School Sessions

Please note that Catch Up Booster sessions and Reading Plus sessions are now taking place before and after school and we remind parents/carers that health and safety protocols are still in place when arriving at/picking up from school earlier or later than normal. **Parents/Carers/Pupils must not access the school site before the session time and must ensure they are vigilant when accessing the playground at 8.20 am as staff may still be driving on to the school site.** Parents/carers must continue to use the one-way system and ensure their children are standing on the class footprints at 8.20am, when a member of staff will come and let them in to school. Please wait at the main school gate and ensure social distance at the end of the afternoon session when waiting to collect your child(ren). We thank you for your support in helping us to comply with the school's health and safety procedures.

Cases of COVID-19 in schools and Social Distancing



Please remember the country is still under lockdown regulations and we cannot stress enough the importance of ensuring that children avoid close contact with children from other 'bubble' groups (unless from the same household or bubble) and that parents/carers maintain social distance before and after leaving the school site. From Mr Grogan

Dear Parents/Carers

We have had a wonderful week in school, and it has been so good to welcome back all the lovely children of our community.

We started the week with a bang by dressing up for World Book Day and the smiles on the faces of the children made all the effort worthwhile, thank you to all those parents who went out of their way to prepare or provide costumes for the children; thanks also to the wonderful staff who also made the effort to make the day extra special for the children.

The primary focus this week has been on ensuring that the children are feeling happy and confident about being back in school. I'm pleased to say that everyone seems to be delighted to be back and all the children seem to have settled into the school routine very quickly.



This week, we have been able to put our new laptops to the test. We recently took delivery of 34 new touch-screen laptops which were finally delivered during lockdown in February. We have had a couple of technical teething issues and have had engineers on site for the last two days, but we are confident now that everything is working as it should be.



The internal network has now been assessed as being strong enough to support the new laptops and, if the wind is blowing in the right direction down the valley, the internet connection is also of sufficient speed to enable 34 consecutive browsing sessions.

I would like to express our gratitude to the Parish Trust as well as to our own parents' group, the LSA - each of these groups have provided grants to school which have enabled us to buy this equipment for the children. We will now be able to use technology much more effectively to support the children's learning and to deliver the computing curriculum.

This morning, Class 4 were engrossed in a Reading Plus task on the new laptops; you could have heard a pin drop!

This week we have introduced the children to the new way of learning at Lothersdale School - **Pirate Fashion!**

We wanted a way to help the children understand about their learning, specifically the importance of memory.

Cognitive science plays a very important role in modern educational thinking, so much so that Ofsted's current inspection framework is based upon the findings of cognitive scientists.

In a nutshell, the science teaches us that in order to strengthen long-term memory, we should recall key information periodically, thus strengthening the memory.

Evidence from cognitive science suggests that this 'retrieval practice' strategy is highly effective - the Lothersdale way to do this is to learn **Pirate Fashion!**

The children will be doing what we call **Arrrghs!** (retrieval practice activities) to help them know more, remember more and do more.

So, if your little pirate comes home saying they've done an **Arrrgh!** today, at least you'll have some idea of what they are talking about.

I hope you all have a very enjoyable weekend.



What a fantastic first week we have had in school! It has been great to hear the 'hustle and bustle' of normal school life after such a long time, and we are so proud and pleased with how the children have settled into the ways of working again.

Thank you for all the help you gave your child with their outfit for World Book Day – we welcomed a fabulous selection of characters into school on Monday morning.

Year 6 have been recalling previously taught knowledge this week, with a particular focus on fractions, decimals and percentages before continuing to consolidate Algebra. English has involved recalling knowledge of grammatical and punctuation elements before returning to the reading of the class text in preparation for our next piece of writing.

Year 5 have settled supremely well into routine this week, almost as if they had not been away. We have spent some of the time this week reviewing the learning which took place at home, and it is clear that the children have worked hard whilst in lockdown. In maths, Year 5 have shown great recall of the key learning about fractions. In English, they have remembered how to use many key elements of grammar in their writing. Well done to the whole year group.

We have continued with our science work, learning about the phases of the moon and will be keeping a moon diary over the course of the next month. A booklet containing five science investigations has been sent home as part of the children's homework tasks. We are asking children to complete a minimum of three of the investigations, but by all means, they may complete all of them if they wish. Please can the evidence of the work they have conducted be brought or emailed to school by Friday 26 March 2021? Thank you very much. Part of the weekly homework involves completing five Reading Plus exercises; please note that these can be completed either at home or at school; the school sessions will run on Tuesday and Friday mornings at 8.20am. Congratulations go to Betsy who has moved up to the next level in Reading Plus - really well done!



TWICE-WEEKLY HOME TESTING FOR COVID-19

I am delighted that children and young people across North Yorkshire are returning to schools and colleges from this week. It has been a difficult few months for many people, and I would like to thank all of you for supporting your children throughout this last lockdown period.

Covid-19 rates in North Yorkshire have been falling steadily over the last month or so, which is very encouraging. However, infection rates are still relatively high and we must continue to do all we can to keep the numbers dropping.

Around 1 in 3 people with coronavirus do not have symptoms but can still pass it on to others. Regular testing of people without symptoms is therefore important to ensure each Covid-19 case is found as quickly and easily as possible. Reducing the spread of the virus is key to avoiding a potential return of tough restrictions and school closures.

All members of households living with primary and secondary school age children as well as college students, including those in their childcare and support bubbles, should complete LFD (lateral flow device) tests at home, twice a week. This is in addition to the standard key preventative measures of 'Hands, Face, and Space'. For further information please visit:

Who is eligible for testing?

LFD testing is for people without symptoms and is available to the following people as schools and colleges reopen:

- Those who live in households, as well as in childcare and support bubbles, of primary and secondary-age pupils and college students
- Those who live in households, as well as in childcare and support bubbles, of staff of primary and secondary schools and colleges

Where are the tests available from?

- Pupils, students and staff working in schools will be provided with testing kits by their school. Testing will take place twice a week and primary school pupils will not be asked to test at this time.
- Members of households who live with primary school, secondary school and college students, as well as those who are part of a childcare or support bubble of pupils, students and staff of schools and colleges, can get their tests in one of the following ways:
 1. through their employer if they offer testing to employees (employers can register for rapid testing here [View website link](#))
 2. by collecting LFD testing kits from a local collection point (see below for details in your area), or
 3. by ordering LFD testing kits online (Please only use the online order service if you cannot get a test through your workplace or by collecting from a local collection point. This will free up home delivery for those who need it most).

Anyone 18 or over can collect home testing kits from the local collection point and you can collect two packs at a time, each pack containing seven tests.

What does home testing involve?

- Using the provided LFD home testing kits, you will test yourself twice a week (every 3 or 4 days). Instructions are provided with the kits.
- You need to report every result to NHS Test and Trace on the same day as you take your test. You can report your result online or by calling 119.

What to do following a positive result?

- Self-isolate immediately,
- get a PCR test to confirm the result (you can book a test here: [View website link](#)),
- follow the stay at home guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection [View website link](#), and
- pupils, students and staff should also tell their school or college if they test positive.

Collection sites

LFD testing kits can be collected between 1pm and 7pm from the following testing sites in North Yorkshire:

- **Harrogate** - Dragon Road Car Park, Dragon Road, Harrogate, HG1 5DB
- **Scarborough** - William Street Car Park, Scarborough. YO12 7PL
- **Northallerton** – The Forum, Bullamore Road, Northallerton, DL6 1LP
- **Selby** – Portholme Crescent Car Park, Selby, YO8 4YR
- **Skipton** - Cavendish Street Car Park, Skipton, BD23 1RP

If you don't live within reasonable travelling distance of one of these sites, you can order kits online: [View website link](#)

As a result of the expansion of asymptomatic testing, symptomatic PCR testing at the five testing sites listed above will only be available in the morning from 8am to 12pm, and appointments need to be booked online or by calling 119. People wanting to book an appointment for the afternoon will find no appointments available and may be directed to another site in a different location. Should this happen, if people prefer to wait and not travel elsewhere, they are encouraged to please try book again (later in the day, or early evening), for an appointment that comes available for the following morning. 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I would like to take this opportunity to thank you again for playing your part to help reduce the spread of Covid-19 across North Yorkshire. In continuing to follow Public Health guidance, we can look forward to easing of restrictions with each step of the roadmap out of lockdown.
