The children worked extremely well in three challenges and Mr Craven was very proud of you all. Well done!

#### **Times Tables Rock Stars Day**

What a brilliant way to start the term with a bang (or should I say a Rock n Roll)! It was fantastic to welcome the children back to school dressed in all of their wonderful costumes. We began the morning with an assembly to discuss the importance of our number facts and set the challenge for the day - to beat the teachers! Over the morning, each class spent time practising their number facts and times tables in preparation to complete against the teachers in some quick-fire questions. All of the teachers were incredibly impressed with how hard the children worked (they really wanted to win!).

Competition time and George in Year 3 was first to challenge a teacher. Mrs Bateman was picked and the first challenge was on. It was a tight battle, 3-1, then back to 3-3 before George eventually overcame the challenge to win the first round 5-4. Unfortunately, this was the writing on the wall for teachers. #### LEGENDS 1st Anniversary ~ Wednesday 17 April 2024

It is hard to believe that LEGENDS is coming up to its first anniversary – where has the time gone!

We thank all our parents/carers for supporting this important school facility over the last year and we look forward to your continued support.

We are celebrating our 1<sup>st</sup> Anniversary with an after school party session next Wednesday, 17 April and invite all our children to attend. Bookings must be made in the normal way and we would ask that you book as soon as possible to avoid disappointment as places are limited.



#### **Traffic Management**

A letter was emailed to parents/carers on Tuesday regarding traffic management outside school and the initiatives implemented by school and parents to help alleviate traffic congestion outside school at peak times.



We would like to extend a special thank you to the fantastic team of parent helpers who have been instrumental in establishing the walking bus initiative. This initiative not only promotes a healthier lifestyle but also helps alleviate traffic congestion around the school. Please see the attached information about the Walking Bus and how your child can participate if feasible for your family.

#### **Lothersdale School Walking Bus**

A new School Walking Bus has been trialled recently and is now open for everyone to join. We'd love for you to be part of it!

#### How it works

**Before school:** Children are dropped off at the layby at 8.20am each morning (we set off at 8.25am so feel free to join us further down the village if you arrive later than this). See map. **After school:** The afternoon bus will meet by the blue tables (on the secure school side of the fence where staff normally release the children) and set off as soon as we've got everyone together. Collection is from the layby at 3.35pm.

**Supervision:** A rota has been drawn, which includes at least two adults per walk. If you're interested in joining the rota, even on an ad hoc basis, please let us know – we welcome as many helpers as possible to allow flexibility within the team.

**Safety:** All of the children joining the Walking Bus will be asked to wear a hi-visibility vest. This is for a few reasons –

- 1) It makes it much easier for the adults to keep an eye on the group
- 2) The children are more visible to cars driving through the village (we've also noticed that this slows the traffic down)
- 3) The adults can count the children more easily before they go into school.
- 4) It's the official Walking Bus kit ... and who wouldn't want to be part of that!

#### **Benefits:**

- fewer cars outside school at drop off / pick up time (one of the trial days saw a reduction of over 10 cars at school!).
- a chance for the children to get more fresh air & exercise.
- a chance for the children to enjoy conversations with friends along the way, or even make new friends.
- parents get a longer day & don't have to struggle for a parking space outside school.

If your child feels a little unsure about the idea, why not join us on the walk with them to offer reassurance and see how they get on? This has worked well for a few children during the trial.

**School permission:** The school requires parents/carers to inform them if their child will be using the <u>afternoon</u> Walking Bus for safeguarding purposes. They don't need to know dates/times; just that the child will be using the Walking Bus at some point.

**Contact:** If you'd like to join the team of helpers, or your child/ren would like to join the Walking Bus, please contact Anna Chapman: 07718 651872. There is a Walking Bus What's App Group that we use for communication (messages are kept to a minimum!).





The walking bus has been brilliant so far. We love walking to school with our friends!

I think the walking bus is helping to reduce traffic near the school and I think it's a great way of helping the children get that extra bit of exercise. The walking bus flips the stress and congestion of drop off time into something really positive!

The energy of the kids and the things they come out with, with the peaceful sights and sounds of the village is a really mindful way to start the day.

Plus, it's free exercise!

It benefits me because I am now able to get a parking space at the school I work at as I can arrive before 8.45am! My boys & I have really enjoyed being part of the walking bus. It's great to see the way the kids of all ages interact and laugh and joke along the way while getting 10 minutes fresh air walking through the village rather than stay in the car waiting for pick up or drop off.

Brilliant idea to help ease the congestion around school.

From a parents' point of view the walking bus allows me to do the school run and still get to work on time, which means I can support more at home and see the kids for longer.

It's a brilliant idea!

It's a healthy, fun & social way to start the day – my son loves it! Absolutely love the idea of the walking bus. I'd never heard of one before. My kids walk each day and thoroughly enjoy every minute. The children are all chatting happily as they walk to school, getting exercise and fresh air as they prepare for the day ahead.
