## Health & Safety Updates

### **Picking Up and Dropping Off ~ Before and After School Sessions**

Please note that Catch Up Booster sessions/Reading Plus sessions and Extended Schools' Activities are now taking place before and after school and we remind parents/carers that health and safety protocols are still in place when arriving at/picking up from school earlier or later than normal. [Parents/Carers/Pupils must not access the school site before the session time and must ensure they are vigilant when accessing the playground at 8.20 am as staff may still be driving on to the school site.](#) Parents/carers must continue to use the one-way system and ensure their children are standing on the class footprints at 8.20am, when a member of staff will come and let them in to school. Please wait at the main school gate and ensure social distance at the end of the afternoon session when waiting to collect your child(ren). We thank you for your support in helping us to comply with the school's health and safety procedures.

### **COVID-19 Restrictions in England ~ Step 2 Roadmap**

Please remember the country is still under lockdown regulations (Step 2 of the Roadmap out of Lockdown ~ please see the attached government poster for your information) and, despite the easing of some restrictions, many restrictions remain in place; outdoor gatherings must still be limited to 6 people or 2 households, for example, and people cannot socialise/stay overnight indoors with anyone they do not live with or have not formed a support bubble with.

We therefore cannot stress enough the importance of ensuring that children continue to avoid close contact with children from other 'bubbles' and that parents/carers maintain social distance before and after leaving the school site. COVID-19 is still a huge risk and we need to continue to try and avoid any outbreaks in school. Thank you for supporting the school in this matter.

We have all enjoyed a thoroughly lovely first week of summer term! The sun has shone, the children have laughed and played, and the water has flowed freely from the taps!

In the last Friday News, I predicted a fabulous summer term, and it has certainly started in a fabulous way. Let's hope it continues and nothing unforeseen gets in the way of the children's learning for the rest of the year. It both inspires and impresses me each time your children return from absences from school - be that holidays or lockdowns or sudden closures - because they do so with such enthusiasm and joy.

This week, our IT support company have loaned us a new set of wireless access points to see if that ironed out the remaining issues we have been having with Wi-Fi and computers. I'm very grateful to Schools ICT for the loan, and I'm confident that they will significantly improve our access in school. This week, the teachers and I spent a staff meeting looking at the computing curriculum and preparing to re-introduce the subject to the children. In the coming weeks, the children will have lots of hands-on experience with our fabulous new laptops, which I'm sure they will all enjoy; they will also learn loads whilst they are doing it.

The laptops purchase was made possible by funding kindly donated by the Village Trust and by our own parents' group, the LSA. We really are extremely grateful for these kind donations.

We also recently bought resources for a STEM club, which I am running in Class 4, with money from the LSA, and I am also ordering a new whole-school reading scheme of brand new books, which is also being funded by a donation from the LSA. The reading scheme has a really wide selection of books to suit all reading ages, from Reception class up to Class 4 – there really is something for everyone. Watch out in weeks to come for the new books appearing in your child's book bag. The younger children's books are specifically matched to the phonics phases and should be fully de-codable for your child as they learn the different phases of phonics. We want to give all the children the best possible start in their reading journey and also provide stimulating and enjoyable reading material as they grow in age and confidence.

I cannot stress enough just how important these additional funds are to our school, and again I'd like to thank all parents/carers who have contributed to fundraising events run by the LSA in the past and especially to those parents/carers who give up their time to help out. Being in a small school has absolutely masses of benefits for the children and staff, and we wouldn't have it any other way; however, small school = small budget, so additional revenue streams are essential in order for us to provide a truly outstanding experience for the children. Hopefully, as restrictions are lifted further, we will be able to put on more events and really kick-start the LSA's fundraising once again.

### **Lost Property**

We currently have a lot of unnamed school uniform/PE kit in school, which causes problems when trying to identify items and return them to the rightful owner. Could all parents/carers please ensure that all clothing/footwear is clearly named to help staff and to avoid clothing ending up unclaimed in lost property. Many thanks for your help.

### **Pupils on Packed Lunches**

May we remind parents to ensure their child's pack up is clearly named and that you give the school office at least two week's term time notice if your child would like to switch to school meals or vice versa. Many thanks.

### **School Meals ~ Class 3 and Class 4**

The cost of school meals for children in Class 3 and Class 4 from 12 April 2021 will continue to be £2.44 per meal (£12.20 per week) for all children.

For parents/carers who wish to pay up to the end of term (Friday 23 July 2021), the cost will be £165.92 per child payable via ParentPay.

For parents/carers who wish to pay up to the end of half-term (Friday 28 May 2021), the cost will be £82.96 per child payable via ParentPay.

Alternatively, parents/carers can pay weekly in advance (£12.20) via ParentPay. Please note that school meals must be paid for in advance and we would also ask parents/carers to refer to the school's School Meals' Arrears Procedure (available to view on the school website) to ensure that you are familiar with the school's course of action should you find yourselves falling behind with payments.

**Please check your ParentPay accounts for credits/outstanding payments (eg illness, educational visits etc) and adjust your child's account accordingly when paying the above.**

### **Eligibility for Free School Meals**

Now that the new academic year has started, may we remind parents that free school meals are available for children whose parents meet the relevant criteria. If you are in receipt of one or more of the following benefits and think you may qualify, please either ask Mrs Ellison for an application form or use the application form available via [www.northyorks.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals](http://www.northyorks.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals)

The relevant criteria is based on receipt of:

- income support
- income-based job seeker's allowance
- income-related employment and support allowance
- child tax credit with an income of less than £16,190 and **not** in receipt of working tax credit
- support under part VI of the immigration and asylum act 1999
- guarantee element of state pension credit.

Where parents are entitled to working tax credit during a four week "run on" period immediately after their employment has ceased, or after they have started to work less than 16 hours per week, their children are entitled to free school meals.

Children who receive income support or income based jobseeker's allowance in their own right are also entitled to free school meals.

Applications are usually processed the same day. If your child is entitled to free school meals you will receive a letter confirming the date when the meals will start. The school is also notified that your child is entitled to free school meals. In the meantime, you should continue to pay for free school meals until confirmation comes through. School may be able to arrange a reimbursement of any monies paid whilst your entitlement is being confirmed. If you are not entitled to free school meals you will be notified in writing.


