Year 6 Crucial Crew Visit ~ Monday 3 April 2017



Our Year 6 children enjoyed a fantastic day out at Eshton Grange on Monday with children from other local schools. Using the outdoor swimming pool, we learnt how to keep ourselves safe around open water, and were given the opportunity to rescue someone in distress using a rope, a pole or a plastic bottle.

Our next workshop, which focused on anti-social behaviour, required the acting skills of Oliver, Ben and Ty. They took on the roles of three school friends who scrawled graffiti on

a wall whilst truanting from school. Some of us were shocked to learn that the boys would have been given a criminal record for such behaviour.

A film clip on railway safety gave us food for thought - did you know that it takes 1.6 miles for a high speed train to brake as it approaches the station? This distance is the equivalent of twenty two premierships football pitches laid end to end.

Northern Powergrid detailed the action we should take in the case of a gas leak, and outlined the dangers associated with electricity sub-stations.

The fire brigade ran a session which clearly informed us of the necessary actions to be taken in the case of a house fire, and representatives from the National Parks explained how to stay safe on a day out in the countryside, teaching us how to make a sling from the clothing we were wearing! Our day was drawn to a close, as we considered the rules associated with the safe use of the internet.

Well done to Nyima and Ty who won prizes for the posters they designed in school. What an informative and interesting day we had!

Swimming Payments

Class 2 swimming lessons are now available on Parentpay. Please note that voluntary contributions can be paid via ParentPay either on a weekly / half-termly or termly basis as set out in the letter to parents/carers dated 17 March 2017.

We would be grateful, however, if the full contribution of £48.40 could be paid by the deadline of Monday 5 June 2017 in order to ensure we meet our providers' costs. No child will be excluded if his or her parents/carers do not contribute, but if insufficient voluntary contributions are received then regrettably, this activity will not go ahead. ***Please note that the school has currently received 50% of contributions towards this activity and requires 85% to make it viable.***

School Meals – Summer Term

Please find attached the menu for the summer term for your information. The cost of school meals from Tuesday 25 April 2017 will remain at £2.10 per meal for all children in Years 3 to 6. Please note that school meals must be paid for in advance and we would also ask parents/carers to refer to the school's School Meals' Arrears Procedure (available to view on the school website) to ensure that you are familiar with the school's course of action should you find yourselves falling behind with payments.

For parents who wish to pay weekly the cost is £10.50 per week payable via ParentPay in advance.

For parents who wish to pay up to the end of the summer term (Friday 21 July 2017) the cost will be £121.80 payable via ParentPay.

For parents who wish to pay up to the end of half-term (Friday 26 May 2017) the cost will be £48.30 payable via ParentPay.

Friday Lunches

If your child is currently on pack ups and booked in for Friday Lunches, the cost for the summer term (to Friday 21 July 2017) will be £25.20 payable via ParentPay. If your child would like a Friday Lunch, please let Mrs Ellison know in the school office.

Please remember to adjust your payments to take into account outstanding payments and school trips etc.

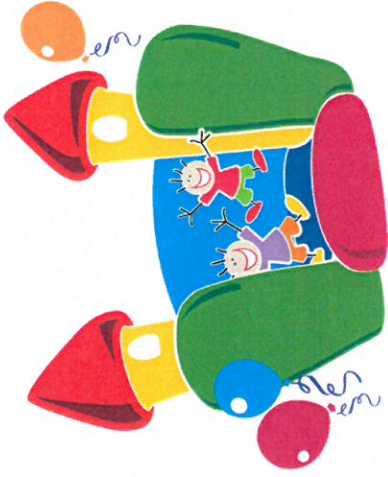
