School Broadband



The new school broadband was installed in school over the Easter break, however we have continued to experience significant issues this week. Water Supply

The new borehole was successfully drilled during the Easter break and the first stage in the process of replacing the existing water supply is now complete. School procedures

As we are starting a new term, we take this opportunity to remind parents/carers about our school procedures:

The start of the school day

School registration takes place at 9.00am and we would be grateful if parents/carers could ensure that all children are on the school playground to enable them to line up in their respective classes when the bell goes at 8.55am.

All gates will be closed and latched/locked by a member of staff after the children have lined up and been brought in to school in the morning.

If you drop your child off at school after 9.00am, please escort your child onto the school premises and ensure that you close/secure all gates behind you when you leave.

Communication/Queries

Our weekly newsletter can be found on the school website along with this half-term's extended schools' activity form and notes to parents/carers. If you have any queries about timings of extended schools' sessions and the forthcoming weeks activities, please use the school website as your first port of call instead of telephoning school. Due to the busy school office environment, it is not always possible for Mrs Ellison to get back to you in the time frame required.

Illness/Absence/Medical Appointments

If your child will not be in school for registration due to illness, other absence or medical appointments, please ensure you contact the school office by 8.45am at the latest on the day to enable the register to be noted accordingly.

If you leave a message on the school answer machine, please ensure you provide a reason for your child's absence.

We would be grateful if you could inform the school office if your child has a medical appointment ~ this also applies if you are collecting your child during the school day so that Mrs Ellison is aware of the time you will be coming into school to collect your child.

Please note that, in order to prevent the spread of the sickness virus around school, please do not send your child into school if they have been sick at home the night before or on the morning of school ~ *please note that children always tell us when they've been sick and we will then have to call you to pick them up!*

Making contact with class teachers before school

Lothersdale Primary School is very proud of its 'open door policy' and its strong relationship with parents/carers and families. Throughout the year there will be times when parents/carers need to talk to teachers before school when something has 'cropped up' e.g. their child is upset about something.

It is very important to us that these matters are followed up quickly and we would request that parents/carers follow the procedures below. These are in preference to waiting until the class teacher collects his/her class from the playground at 8.55am, as this can result in the teachers being late for registration and delay the start of lessons. Also, between 8.45 and 8.55am, class teachers are talking to their teaching assistants about the morning lessons and we would ask parents/carers to avoid calling into the school office and requesting to speak to teachers, or Mrs Robinson, during this time to avoid any disruption to this key part of the school day.

If you wish to speak to a class teacher, or Mrs Robinson, before school starts please either:

- **Telephone school between 8.00 and 8.15am to arrange a short face to face meeting or telephone call with a class teacher or Mrs Robinson on the same morning before school between 8.30 and 8.45am.**
- **If the query is less important, please telephone school between 8.00am and 12.00pm and leave a message for a teacher to telephone you back on the same day and answer your questions or to make an appointment to meet in school.**

Please also note that class teachers will normally be on the playground at the end of the school day and are available to talk to at this time as well.

School Uniform

May we remind parents/carers that traditional black school shoes should be worn by children in school as part of our School Uniform Policy. Please do not send children in black boots (this includes Doc Martins), trainers, fashion shoes or ballet style shoes as these are not regulated footwear suitable for everyday school life. A copy of our school uniform list is available to view on the school website.

Long Hair

May we remind parents/carers that children with long hair must have hair tied back in a ponytail/plait. Hair clips and bobbles (in the Lothersdale School colours - royal blue, black or grey) should be small and unobtrusive.

School Bookbags

If you are ordering a new bookbag for your child, please note the following:

Class 1 and Class 2 ~ large standard bookbag (*please ensure the strap is removed*)

Class 3 and Class 4 ~ large standard bookbag with strap

The above bookbags form part of the school's uniform policy and no other type of bookbag should be brought into school (ie., rucksack, flight bag, etc).

Unfortunately the school does not have the capacity to store these bags in classrooms and it therefore poses a health and safety risk. Please note that additional items of clothing/footwear for PE or after school activities must be brought in as small a bag as possible.

Please note that the school purchases bookbags and PE bags on behalf of parents/carers as part of the new starter welcome pack and these are payable via ParentPay. If you have a sibling starting school in September and you do not wish the school to purchase these items on your behalf, please let Mrs Ellison know by Friday 10 May 2019.

PE Sessions ~ Summer Term

Please remember that full PE kit should be in school every day during the Summer Term. Now that the majority of our PE sessions are spent outdoors, it would be beneficial if all children (Class 1 to Class 4) have a pair of trainers for these sessions. Black pumps are ideal for indoor use but not supportive enough for running and high impact PE sessions. Please make sure that all items of clothing and footwear are named and kept at school in a named school PE bag.
