
No Dogs on School Premises

NSPCC Speak Out. Stay Safe. Assembly ~ Monday 15 May 2023



On Monday morning we started the week with two assemblies (one for each key stage) where Mrs Bateman talked about the NSPCC's **Speak Out Stay Safe** programme.

The children watched videos presented by Ant & Dec and NSPCC staff. Buddy, the NSPCC mascot told the children that worries should not be carried but be shared with trusted adults who will help. The Childline telephone number 0800 1111 was chanted and learnt.

Later in the week Class 4 had an NSPCC workshop where the messages were repeated and looked into in more depth appropriate for the older children and Mrs Bateman recapped the NSPCC messages with the younger children in school.

Finally, <u>Buddy Zone</u>, on the Childline website, has some games and activities for the children to do.



Science Fair

Lothersdale Primary School's Science Fair took place on Wednesday 17 May 2023 and has again proven to be a huge success.

Parents and the community were able to come along after school on Wednesday to look at the pupils projects on display and, on Thursday, pupils were able to view each other's projects and take part in some of the experiments – there were lots of happy faces!

Mrs (Professor) Woolley, our local scientist, was on hand to help Mrs Knight with the judging this year. They both agreed that there were so many original and impressive experiments and projects. A huge well done to everyone who participated. A favourite of Mrs Woolley's was from Jude D who had researched how our heart rate can change after different food or drinks. He had a clear hypothesis method, results table and linked his understanding to maths. Mrs Woolley will be avoiding hot salsa from now on!

Another favourite from Mrs Knight was a very informative explanation of how a lung works with an inventive bottle demonstration from Isobel. Isobel used fantastic science vocabulary explaining how our diaphragm works. A firm favourite from the children was the original forensic science idea by Evie K, who had investigated if our fingerprints are the same.

The interactive part was a crowd pleaser as many children checked their own fingerprints to classify them. George and Lily worked together to show how a balloon rocket works and even included Newton's third law of physics in their project and could explain it! Totally incredible explanations and demonstration too.

Mrs Woolley was unable to make a final decision but narrowed it down to the following five projects: Earthquake and building stability
Forensic science
Balloon rocket
Flying tea bag
Clock experiment

Overall, it was very difficult to choose a winner. Taking 1st prize in this year's science fair is... Drum roll please... HP's flying tea bag experiment! Not only was he able to explain in detail what he did, but we loved the written conclusion and liked the fact that the experiment went wrong, however he did it again and helped improve the rocket.

All the children in Year 4 are really looking forward to the residential visit to Eshton Grange next week. Medicine

Please do not bring any prescribed or non-prescribed medicines into school on Wednesday unless you have completed an Agreement to Administer Medicine form. Please note that medicines, including non-prescriptive medicines such as Calpol or travel sickness tablets, <u>cannot</u> be given to children unless a form has been completed.

If you think your child may need to take non-prescribed or prescribed medicine during the residential visit and staff have not been made aware, then please complete the Agreement to Administer Medicine form, which is available to download from the Class 3 page on the school website. Completed forms and medicine <u>must</u> be brought into school on or before 24 May 2023 and handed to Mr Craven or the school office. *Please <u>do not pack any medicine in your child's bags. Medicines must NOT be handed to a member of staff on Wednesday morning without completing the appropriate form.*</u>

Please note that it is anticipated the children will return to school at approximately 2.30pm on Friday 26 May 2023. Please inform Mrs Ellison in the school office if your child will not be collected at 2.30pm so that we can safely account for all children at this time ~ we will need to know if your child will be picked up as normal at 3.15pm, staying for Football or Sewing Clubs or will be going to LEGENDS Before & After School Club.

If you have siblings in school, they can also go home with you at 2.30pm. If we do not hear otherwise, we will assume your child will be collected at 2.30pm and will ensure siblings are ready to go home too.


All extended schools' activities finish during the week ending Friday 14 July 2023. The activity lists will be available to view on the school website on Monday 5 June 2023.

this version. The photographs were great with some excellent combinations which produced great results. A lot of work has gone into this one and I can tell.


Static electricity: The science explanations are superb. Very accurate and correct. I also liked the equipment underneath it which showed the experiments and the equipment used. I went home and tried the salt and pepper experiment and the dragon one was a fab, original idea. Next time they can do the assembly! Some great GCSE Physics here with high level explanations. Great work!

Earthquakes: I love the idea of using lego to test the stability of different materials and will use this in my lesson at school when I do stability and centre of mass. The earthquake diagrams were superb. The shake table with lego again is so original. For originality it was incredible!!!!!!

Forensic science: A really original idea. I love the way the student has done fingerprints of every finger for each member of the family and then looked at the print and classified them. Some great forensic science here and totally different from all other entries!

Flying teabag experiment: I'm impressed with this one. When I did this in my science lab it proved to be a huge mistake. Always do it outside! I loved the conclusion and also liked the fact that the experiment went wrong but they did it again and helped improve their rocket. This is a great write up.

Well done to everyone who took part this year. You are all amazing Scientists and we cannot wait to see more of your ideas at next year's Science Fair!
