Health & Safety Update

'Stranger Danger'

The half-term holiday is now upon us and, as the weather is so nice and children are out playing in the park, we would like to remind parents/carers to talk to their children about 'stranger danger'. This is particularly important due to an incident reported to the police this week about two men in a white van approaching a 12 year old boy in Cross Hills around 4pm on Tuesday.

Although these incidents are rare, we would ask parents/carers to be more vigilant over the summer period to help keep our children safe.

General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)

We're sure you will have noticed that the new General Data Protection Regulations come into effect today, Friday 25 May 2018, and we have been busy behind the scenes establishing how much of an impact this will have on Lothersdale Primary School. The school already complies with the Data Protection Act (DPA) 1998 and the new requirements strengthen many of the DPA's principles.

School Communication

Certain school communications, such as letters from staff, texts, emails, the school's regular newsletter and LSA information are essential to the operation of the school. These messages will cease when your child leaves Lothersdale Primary School. We would like to update our consents for our home/school communication and ask you continue to 'opt in' by completing the yellow communications consent form and return it to school on Monday 4 June 2018. This will enable us to update our records and comply with the new regulations.

Lothersdale Legends

Lothersdale Legends are an important part of our school life and the end of the week is always an exciting time for the children when they are chosen to be that week's Lothersdale Legend. However, in order to comply with GDPR, we have had to modify how we highlight our weekly 'Legends' and therefore the following changes have been made:

- Lothersdale Legend certificates will no longer be available to view in the main reception area. The certificates will be replaced by a star for each year group and a child's name will appear on the star each week.
- The certificate will be sent out to parents/carers via bookbags as normal, however the certificate will only show the child's photograph.

The school is using Veritau as its Data Protection Officer and we will notify you of any future important changes as and when they occur.

Year 6 ~ Bikeability (Cycle Training) ~ July 2018

Just a reminder that Year 6 will be taking part in Bikeability sessions on Tuesday 10 and Wednesday 11 July 2018. They will need to have a bike in good working order and suitable for riding on the road. Helmets are also compulsory. Please take the opportunity over the half-term break to make sure your child's bike is safe to ride. We have sent out an M Check sheet with your child today, which details what you need to check to ensure the bike is safe. Further details and consent will be issued nearer the time.

Helmet Check

Ensure helmets fit tightly around the circumference of the head and the strap is secure below the chin, with enough room for two fingers between the strap and the chin.

Bike Check

Before you set off on any ride, check all bikes in the group are in good working order. Remember your ABC: A - air, B - brakes, C - chain.

- Brakes - check the front brake by rolling the bike forward and applying the brake. The bike should stop quickly. Ensure you can fit two fingers between the brake lever and handlebar. Roll the bike backwards to check the rear brake.
- Tyres - squeeze the sidewall of the tyre to check the air pressure. There should be no give and the tyre should feel solid.

This Privacy Notice has been written to inform parents and pupils of Lothersdale Primary School about what we do with your personal information. This Notice may be subject to change as the Data Protection Bill progresses.

Who are we?

Lothersdale Primary School is a 'Data Controller' as defined by Article 4 (7) of GDPR. This means that we determine the purposes for which, and the manner in which, your personal data is processed. We have a responsibility to you and your personal data and will only collect and use this in ways which are compliant with data protection legislation.

The school has appointed Veritau Ltd to be its Data Protection Officer (DPO). The role of the DPO is to ensure that the school is compliant with GDPR and to oversee data protection procedures. Veritau's contact details are:

What information do we collect?

The categories of information that we collect, hold and share include the following:

- Personal information of pupils and their family members e.g. name, pupil number, DOB and address
- Educational attainment
- Free school meal eligibility
- Attendance information
- Assessment information
- Behavioural information
- Safeguarding information

We will also process certain 'special category' data about our pupils including:

- Relevant medical information - please note that where the pupil has a severe allergy, or is thought to be at risk of needing emergency care for a medical issue, then this will be shared with all the staff. We may do this in the form of photo identification in the staff room to ensure that all staff are aware of the issues should an emergency situation arise
- Special Educational Needs and Disabilities information
- Race, ethnicity and religion

Why do we collect your personal data?

We use the information we collect:

- to support pupil learning
- to monitor and report on pupil progress
- to provide appropriate pastoral care
- to assess the quality of our services
- to safeguard pupils
- to comply with the law regarding data sharing

Any personal data that we process about our pupils and parents is done so in accordance with Article 6 and Article 9 of GDPR:

Our legal basis for processing your personal data, in line with Article 6(1)(c) include:

- Education Act 1944,1996, 2002
- Education and Adoption Act 2016
- Education (Information About Individual Pupils) (England) Regulations 2013
- Education (Pupil Information) (England) Regulations 2005
- Education and Skills Act 2008
- Children Act 1989, 2004
- Children and Families Act 2014
- Equality Act 2010
- Education (Special Educational Needs) Regulations 2001

We also process information in accordance with Article 6(e) and Article 9(2)(g) as part of the official authority vested in us as Data Controller and for reasons of substantial public interest. Such processing, which is not mandatory but is considered to be in our pupils' interests, include:

- School trips
- Extra-curricular activities

Whilst the majority of pupil information you provide to us is mandatory, some of it is provided to us on a voluntary basis. When we do process this additional information we will ensure that we ask for your consent to process this.

Who do we share your personal data with?

We routinely share pupil information with:

- schools that the pupils attend after leaving us
- our Local Education Authority (North Yorkshire County Council)
- the Department for Education (DfE)
- National Health Service bodies
- Yorkshire Collaborative Academy Trust
- ICT Programme Providers, eg. Parentpay

We will not share any information about you outside the school without your consent unless we have a lawful basis for doing so.

How long do we keep your personal data for?

Lothersdale Primary School will keep your data in line with our Information Policy. Most of the information we process about you will be retained as determined by statutory obligations. Any personal information which we are not required by law to retain will only be kept for as long as is necessary to fulfil our organisational needs.

What rights do you have over your data?

Under GDPR parents and pupils have the following rights in relation to the processing of their personal data:

- to be informed about how we process your personal data. This notice fulfils this obligation
- to request access to your personal data that we hold, and be provided with a copy of it
- to request that your personal data is amended if inaccurate or incomplete
- to request that your personal data is erased where there is no compelling reason for its continued processing
- to request that the processing of your personal data is restricted
- to object to your personal data being processed

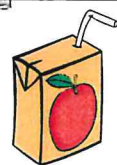
