

Headteacher update

Dear Parents / Carers

I cannot believe how quickly this last half term is flying by, and each time I think about the end of term I'm reminded that we will soon have to say goodbye to a really wonderful group of children in Year 6. I really hope they enjoy their last weeks with us and carry happy memories with them as they move on.

We have lots of fun activities planned for them and the other children in the final weeks and I am sure all the children will have a great last few weeks of term. Excitement for Sports Day is already beginning to build in school, and I hope that many of you are able to join us on the afternoon of 7th July across in the park and then afterwards on the playground for the LSA Summer Fair. Each of these events promises to be lots of fun.

The LSA are still busy planning and organising fundraising events, like the Summer Fair, and continue to provide such a valuable service to our school. I am really excited about the forthcoming library revamp which is scheduled to be done during the school holidays. The plans we have been given look great and the work will really enhance the provision we can offer the children. We have also invested in new library management software and will be appointing junior librarians in September to help us manage the system and the books on a day-to-day basis.

I am aware that there have been a significant number of messages sent home from school this week, either verbal, email or text, and I know this can seem overwhelming at times. What we want to do is to keep parents/carers fully informed about events in school and ensure key messages get to you in a timely fashion. Sometimes messages can be mixed, like the book bag messages this week; I apologise for any confusion that was caused by mixed-messaging and for that reason, and for the sake of clarity, I want to highlight a few areas of school policy on the following two pages. Please take the time to read through and hopefully things will then be clearer.

If you ever have concerns about anything concerning your child's time with us, please do not hesitate to get in touch – I am always more than happy to speak with parents/carers, and so often face-to-face or telephone conversations are the best way to ensure understanding.

School Book bags

Whilst this is not included on our School Uniform list, the use of keyrings has been encouraged on book bags to help the children easily identify their own bag. This helps the children in Class 1 especially as their bags are stored together in easily accessible boxes. In all other classes, the book bags are kept in individual plastic drawers in or near the classrooms.

The issue that arose this week was that due to the number of keyrings on some bags, the drawers would not close; this presented a trip hazard in a classroom and a potentially serious accident very nearly occurred. As a result, we ask that **children who wish to personalise their book bag do so with just one small keyring**. If a drawer will not close because of a large keyring, the child will be asked to remove it from the bag.

School Uniform

Like every primary school, we have a uniform policy which we ask parents to adhere to. The last thing any of our staff want to be doing is pulling children up because of uniform issues, and our children do not like breaking the rules either; at primary age particularly, the responsibility invariably falls to the adults at home.

We have very high standards in all areas - academic, behaviour and dress - and I am sure that is one of the reasons that parents choose Lothersdale School. In order to maintain our high standards, we have to ask that children are dressed for school appropriately, in accordance with the policy, which is attached again for reference. The majority of the items on the list are freely available from any supermarket, and only the branded items need to be purchased from a specialist shop.

Water Bottles

As part of the uniform policy, all children should have a school water bottle for use in class, in PE, at lunch etc. We supply fresh, filtered water via our on-site water treatment plant, so the children are free to refill their water at any point in the day. *Children who bring a packed lunch may bring their own healthy, non-fizzy drink* to have with their lunch; they should also have a school water bottle for class.

Traffic Management Outside School

We have received several complaints over recent weeks, from our own parents/carers as well as from villagers, regarding poor parking at the end of the school day, particularly cars parking on the white and yellow 'Keep Clear' areas by the school playground.

We would like to thank all those parents/carers who diligently adhere to the rules and show respect to other drivers and people who live in the village. It is difficult to navigate the road around school, particularly in the afternoon, and most of the time people show great patience and understanding when collecting children. As a reminder to some, please do not park in front of driveways and access ways (including access to fields and the main school vehicle entrance), or on the white and yellow Keep Clear areas. These markings were put down to help alleviate traffic problems and to help ensure the safety of all road and footpath users, *especially our children*.

The school has no jurisdiction over parking and can only continue to send out polite reminders to parents/carers, however, the local police have agreed to visit school to carry out spot checks between now and the end of term.

Important Safeguarding Update ~ School Collection Arrangements at 3.15pm

Following recent discussions with the police, we have updated our safeguarding procedures, specifically in relation to site security. This has resulted in a slight change to collection arrangements at the end of the school day:

We would be grateful if parents/carers could refrain from entering the school grounds before 3.10pm (the last lesson) to enable us to use the playground and/or get children safely back on to the school playground from the playing field. Having collected your children, please leave the school site promptly.

Woodland Area

Signs have now been installed on the gates to the Woodland Area of the playground. For their own safety, please do not allow your children to enter this area before or after school. Children are able to use the Woodland Area during school time under the supervision of school staff.

Remember, please contact me if you would like to discuss these or any other points regarding your child's experience at school. I want communication to be open and a 2-way thing so please do speak up if you are concerned about something – I may be able to help.

Thank you for taking the time to read these updates - thanks also for your understanding and for supporting us in helping to keep all children and staff safe.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE



Our current attendance is below the National Expectation of 96% and it is really important to us that this improves so that children continue to make outstanding progress in their learning.

The teaching staff have worked, and continue to work, very hard to ensure all our children meet the expected standard after the disruptions to learning caused by the COVID pandemic, but this can only be achieved if children are in school all day, every day.

Many families are wanting to take long overdue holidays and the school office has seen an increase in holiday request forms since Easter. We fully appreciate that many families lost out on holidays due to the pandemic and had to re-book. Hopefully, families have now caught up with missed holidays and normality has returned.

Please remember that we cannot authorise term-time holidays, and if your child misses 10 or more sessions, then this has to be referred to the council. Please note, it is not the school that makes the decision on fining, it is the Local Authority.



School Diversity Week and Rainbow Monday

There was a joyous explosion of colour in school on Monday as we celebrated the start of School Diversity Week 2022. The week began with an assembly exploring diversity. We learnt that families can be made up with different combinations of children and adults. It was wonderful to hear the children say that the common factor should be love and respect.

KS2 joined 67 other schools from around the country on an online writing workshop with the author Benjamin Dean. This was a positive and inspiring session which encouraged the children to believe that they too could be published authors. Benjamin shared pictures of himself at primary school and told them about the first story he wrote aged 8 and his latest novel, *The Secret Sunshine Project* (copies of which we have in classes 3 and 4 for the children to read).



We were also happy to welcome 6th form students and staff from South Craven School who came to see how diversity and inclusion are taught in primary. They saw the high quality picture books we have for young children to share and the positive message about respect they convey.
