This week the whole school enjoyed talks on both animal and farm safety. Mrs McGarrell brought in some goats and spoke to the children about what we need to do to be safe around farm animals. Importantly for our children, they discussed how to safely walk across a field of cows. The children learnt the importance of walking slowly and quietly so not to be of any interest to the cows. They also learnt why it is so important to always wash hands

after being around farm animals.



Mr Smith led a session on farm safety and being safe around different farm machinery, animals and chemicals found on a farm. He brought with him three tractors and some different trailers and equipment to show the children. They were all very engaged and interested in what he had to say.

Class 1 ~ Art Project



We have been learning about the work of the French artist, Henri Matisse in Class 1. The children have looked at his cut-out works of art including The Snail and The Wheat Sheaf. The children have discussed the colours and shapes Henri used in his modern art and how he was inspired by nature.

Class 2 ~ Art Project



Class 2's art project is focused on the life and paintings of the artist, Henri Rousseau.

The children have enjoyed looking at key features of his artwork. They have used their sketch books to practice different techniques used by Rousseau to replicate some of his art.

So far they have done a colour wash and created the background to their final piece of artwork. Next week they will add the final feature, which is a jungle animal.

Class 3 Visit to Cliffe Castle Museum ~ Thursday 20 June 2019

Last week, Class 3 ventured to Cliffe Castle to enjoy an end of topic trip about the Stone Age. All children were well behaved and this was commented on by Cliffe Castle staff. During the workshop some children had to dress up in different outfits to represent a different time in history. As a class we then had to put the children in order and explain how times changed from the Stone Age to modern times. Throughout the morning, the children split off into three groups and engaged well with three different activities.



Activity 1:

The children were able to handle real artefacts and match the problem card to the artefact by working collaboratively. We found out that the Stone Age people made needles from animal bones to sew the animal fur together to make clothing.

Activity 2:

Children were real archaeologists and had to

dig to find artefacts. They then had to figure out from which time in history their artefact came from. Children used their prior knowledge from other history topics to help them to be successful.

Activity 3:



Observing delicate artefacts, the children had to discuss and sketch the dig site left from a bronze age settlement. The children were able to see similarities and differences between how the Stone Age people and how the Bronze Age people lived.

After lunch in the conservatory, we were able to enjoy some sunshine in the park outside before heading back into the museum to find out more about the Stone Age. All children worked hard to construct pottery, find



artefacts from the three ages of prehistory and made their own Stone Age weapons and tools.

Miss Gallagher would like to thank the parent (and grandparent) helpers who attended the trip, as without their help we wouldn't be able to extend children's knowledge by attending educational visits like this. Thank you to Mrs McGarrell, Mrs

Harrison and Mrs Coates. Additionally, well done to all children in Class 3 for working well, showing respect to the general public and museum staff members and being a pleasure to take out of school for the day.

Class 3 ~ Art Project





Class 3 have been learning all about Vincent van Gogh and why he was famous. The children know when he lived and that he was a postimpressionist (using bright colour to represent emotions).



The class studied how van Gogh created movement through the paintings of sunflowers by using line, colour, shape and tone and have used a mixture of watercolour and acrylic paint.

The children produced their own amazing paintings of peonies in the style of van Gogh, by using impasto (thick layers of paint) and bold brush strokes.

Class 4 visit to Murton Park (York) ~ Friday 21 June 2019



Class 4 had an amazing time at Murton Park on Friday when we took on the role of Roman soldiers for the day. Complete with authentic tunics, helmets, shields and weapons, we completed training with spears and daggers. In the 'Fabrica' (workshop), we learnt how to make oil lamps from clay, in the 'Principia' (headquarters) we

wrote using Roman script, and caught up with our fellow comrades in the 'Lavatorium' (toilet block). We were pleased that we had learnt the 'Testudo' (tortoise formation) as we were attacked by a stray warrior from the Celtic settlement. Thankfully, down to our excellent skills, communication and planning, we fought off the intruder and arrived back safely in Lothersdale as planned! The Centurion commented on the children's excellent behaviour, listening skills, ability to follow instructions and enthusiasm throughout our stay. We were very proud of them all. We would like to thank Mr Oddy, Mrs Smith and Mr Cullen for accompanying us on our exciting trip.

Class 4 ~ Arts Project







In Class 4 this week, we have started to study our chosen artist, David Hockney. We have discovered that he was born in Bradford in 1937

and attended art school in London before moving to Los Angeles in the 1960s. In the 1970s, he began working in photography, creating

photo collages he called joiners. He still continues to create and exhibit art, and in 2011 he was voted the most influential British artist of the 20th century.

We have considered the artists from whom Hockney took inspiration: Matisse, Picasso, Fragonard and Van Gogh. Over the next few lessons, we will be analysing his different styles of work including Pop Art, Cubism, Figurative Art, Impressionism and the influence of the Baroque period. Ultimately we will be producing our own pieces, taking inspiration from Hockney's style.


