# Message from Mrs Walker Executive Headteacher

Hello everyone!

As we finally come to the end of this academic year and an extremely busy week of events in school, it is of course time to say lots of **special goodbyes** to those pupils and staff who will be leaving us. Our 18 **Y6 pupils** who will be joining their new secondary schools in September have been a wonderful cohort and we are very proud of the progress and many achievements they have made over the year and across their time in Lothersdale, including some excellent end of KS2 SATs results which have been shared with them this week (and see below). I have enjoyed the chance to get to know them all a little during my time in school this year and wish them all the very best for what I'm sure will be very exciting futures. We say a special thank you also to their families for the support they have given to their children and the school over the years. We are also losing **5 other pupils** and their families from across school due to house and school moves, so we wish them well in their new settings and again, say a big thank you to their families too for their work and support during their time with us.

As detailed in previous Friday News reports, this week we said farewell to some **staff members** who have contributed in so many different ways to the school over the last few years: **Mrs Hill, Mrs Aldren and Miss Baker. Amandine Driver** is also sadly leaving her role as French teacher at Lothersdale to take up a new teaching post at Giggleswick School, although will still remain linked to our school in an advisory capacity for French; next year, class teachers will take over the teaching of weekly French across school, with support and planning from Amandine.

This week, it was great to be able to celebrate our pupils' achievements in the **end of year assessments** and we hope that you have enjoyed reading your child's report, which provides more detail about these and progress made over the year or key stage. In the end of KS2 (Y6) SATs, our pupil cohort achieved above or well-above national scores at both expected and greater depth standards in Reading, Maths, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling and Reading/Writing/Maths combined. In other nationally-reported assessments lower down the school, we have had similarly excellent results too: at the end of KS1 (Y2), results were above or well-above national expectations; in the Y1 Phonics Test, 100% pass was achieved by the cohort, well above the national 76%; and at the end of EYFS, another above national result was achieved for the 'Good Level of Development' measure. A HUGE well done to all our fantastic pupils – they should be very proud of their achievements! A big thank you to our wonderful staff team for all the hard work, teaching and support they put in every day to make a difference to every pupil in our care; and also, thanks from us in school to all our families at home for your ongoing support.

And finally... as I leave my role as Executive Head today, handing over to Mrs Tyson in September, I would like to say **my own special farewell and thank you** to everyone in our whole school team and community for the support you have given me over the last 1 ½ terms. It has been a challenging year of change and development for the school. I have thoroughly enjoyed my role leading and working with you all, the inspiring pupils, incredibly dedicated staff – very ably led by your interim Heads of School, Mrs Bateman and Mr Craven, supportive governor team and families. I know that we have achieved much over a short time together! I wish you all the very best in your next phase of development – which I'm sure is going to be a very exciting and promising one – and I will take away many happy memories of the very special school community which Lothersdale is and which it has been a real privilege to be part of this year.

#### Summer Reading Challenge



This year's Summer Reading Challenge 'Ready, Set, Read' aims to keep children's minds and bodies active over the summer break, empowering young people to forge new connections with others and unleash the power of play, sport and physical activity through reading.

Children are challenged to get reading over the summer holidays. From July to September, through taking part in the free Challenge, children will be able to join a superstar team and their marvellous mascots as they navigate a fictional summer obstacle course brought to life with illustrations by children's illustrator Loretta Schauer, rewarded by free incentives including stickers.

The Summer Reading Challenge shines a light on the power of public libraries as a hub for local communities and will bring together the benefits of sport, play and creativity. The Youth Sport Trust has developed fun family activity cards, which alongside the official 2023 Summer Reading Challenge book collection, will aim to keep imaginations moving over the school holiday. The Challenge and activity cards are available to access through the online digital platform, <u>summerreadingchallenge.org.uk</u>, to allow those with limited physical access to the library to join in. By participating in the challenge, young people will have the opportunity to explore new reading material, develop skills, and discover new interests.

#### School Office ~ End of Year

Next week, Mrs Ellison will be carrying out year end protocols in school and it is therefore important that all parent payment portals are up-to-date or in credit.

Please therefore ensure that your child(ren)'s ParentPay, SchoolGrid and School Gateway accounts have <u>a zero or credit balance</u> when school closes on Friday 21 July 2023, particularly if your child is a Year 6 leaver.

If you do receive any text or email reminders over the next couple of weeks, we would be grateful if you could ensure that any requested information or payment is provided as soon as possible to support us with our end of year administration.

#### ParentPay and School Gateway

Over the summer we are hoping to move cashless payments from ParentPay to School Gateway, to make administration less time consuming and to cut down on the number of parental logins. The School Gateway app is currently used to book onto LEGENDS Before and After School Club and we would ask that all parents/carers set up an account if you have not done so already to help with the transition. Instructions to access the app are included in the LEGENDS Parental Handbook which was emailed to parents/carers towards the end of the Spring term.

#### Extended Schools' Activities ~ Autumn Term

We will be working on our autumn term extended schools' activities over the summer break and a copy of the activity flyer will be emailed out to parents/carers when this has been finalised.

#### Class 3 Swimming Lessons (current Year 2 & Year 3)

Class 3 swimming lessons will start on Friday 8 September 2023 and a letter will be sent out to all parents/carers of children currently in Year 2 and Year 3 over the summer holidays once we receive the costings from Craven Pool.

The payment for the Class 3 Swimming lessons will also be added to SchoolGateway over the summer. Please note that, although these lessons are part of the school curriculum, the school receives no extra funding for swimming and relies on parental contributions to enable the children to take part in this activity.

This academic year the school has had to absorb the unexpected extra cost of the swimming lessons because of the percentage of contributions received:

Class 3 – 78% Class 3 – 93%

As funding is extremely tight across all schools, this is having a negative impact on our learning resources and we would be extremely grateful if you could therefore help us by contributing towards your child's autumn term swimming lessons, however small that contribution may be.

No child will be excluded if his or her parents/carers do not contribute, but if insufficient voluntary contributions are received then regrettably, this activity will not continue.

#### **Dolce** ~ School Meal Provision

A letter has been emailed alongside this week's newsletter for parents/carers of children currently in Reception to Year 5 regarding an update on our catering provision and an increase in the cost of a school meal for children currently in Year 2 to Year 5.


We are thrilled to announce that the total amount raised is a whopping £2,070.00!!
