Health & Safety Update!

Before and After School ~ Playground Supervision

Concerns have been raised regarding children climbing or sitting on school boundary walls and playing near the beck in the area behind the parent shelter in the playground, before or after school. Please note that these areas are out of bounds to all children in line with the school's behaviour and health and safety policies and all children are aware of these rules during school time.

The school day starts at 9am and ends at $3.15 \, \mathrm{pm} \sim \mathrm{all}$ children $\mathrm{\underline{must}}$ therefore be supervised by parents/carers if they are on the playground before $9.00 \, \mathrm{am}$ and after $3.15 \, \mathrm{pm}$. We do have staff supervision present on the playground from $8.45 \, \mathrm{am}$ to help parents/carers if it is necessary to leave your child to head off to work etc., but if parents/carers remain on the playground you are responsible for supervising your child and ensuring they are behaving appropriately. We would be grateful if parents/carers could support the school's policies by not allowing children to climb/sit on walls or play near the beck at any time.


General School Updates

Tudor/Elizabethan/Shakespeare

So you're having a dressing up day? Don't panic! Even if you've forgotten about it until 8pm the night before, you can still manage to whip up a costume with some simple items in your house. There's no need for any buying or sewing!

In the 16th century there were strict laws about what colours and types of clothing you could wear depending on your status. Rich people could wear silks, velvets and bright colours, whereas poor people were only allowed linen, wool, and dull colours.

16th Century boy:

- Shirt: Long-sleeved neutral-coloured T-shirt
- Waistcoat (called a doublet)
- Floppy woollen cap (or any brimmed hat)
- Leather belt
- Loose shorts or 3/4 length trousers
- Long socks (stockings in Tudor times!)
- Leather shoes or boots

16th Century girl


- Hair covered with a cap or cloth (see below)
- Long sleeved dress
- Waistcoat
- Long skirt over the dress
- Apron over the skirt
- Stockings or long socks
- Leather school shoes (Tudors had the same design!)



reasons to vaccinate your child

What should I do?

Contact your GP if your child is aged two or three years old and you haven't heard from their GP by early November. If your child is at primary school and is eligible, the school will send you a consent form. Please sign and return it. If your child has a health condition that puts them at greater risk from flu, they are also eligible for the flu vaccine.






